How to Enter:

- 1. Submit your photographs and haiku here.
- 2. Submissions can be made from March 8 March 31 at 6:00 pm ET.
- 3. Only ONE (1) photograph (10 mb max) entry per category. *The same photo may NOT be used in multiple categories.*
- 4. Only ONE (1) haiku entry per person.

Judging:

Winners will be determined by vote of the Earth Day Planning Committee. Winners will be announced the week of April 17, 2023, via DOECAST. The winning photographs and haiku will be featured on the DOE Earth Day EnergyHub page (coming soon).

You also represent that the haiku is your original work, does not infringe upon any copyright, proprietary right, or any other right whatsoever of any party, and that you have made no agreements inconsistent with this permission.

What is a Haiku?

Haiku is a Japanese poem of seventeen syllables, in three lines of five, seven, and five syllables, traditionally evoking images of the natural world. **2022's winner:** Treetops gently sway Like a graceful green ballet Celebrating Earth
