



# Why Do Batteries Sometimes Catch Fire and Explode?

A new study led by Nitash Balsara of Berkeley Lab's Materials Sciences Division reveals surprising clues into the causes behind the rare event of a lithium-ion battery catching fire after fast charging. The researchers used an imaging technique called "operando X-ray microtomography" at the Advanced Light Source to probe lithium-graphite battery materials at high resolution.
